Goal 2: Create & Sustain a Violence Prevention Coordinated Community Response Team (CCRT)






CCRT: It's All About Collaboration

Goal 4: Increase Training for Individuals Responding to Sexual Violence

UT Police:

- Trauma Informed Response to Sexual Violence
 — This training curriculum is administered to Law Enforcement and other parties responsible for investigating and responding sexual violence.
 - Delivered to all UT Police Officers in 2017
 - Trainings provided to other campus and municipal law enforcement agencies across the state of Tennessee
- Trauma Informed Response for Communications Officers-Administered to dispatch and initial call takers best practices for providing a trauma informed approach during the first contact with law enforcement.


Office of Student Conduct & Community Standards:
