Title IX reaches out to offer Supportive Measures and Reporting Options

Complainant Options Include

Supportive Measures Only

- A Complainant can choose to receive only resources and Supportive Measures from the Office of Title IX.
- Complainant <u>DOES NOT</u> have to pursue a formal investigation.
- A Complainant can change their mind at any time and file a formal complaint.

File a Formal Complaint

- A Complainant can choose to file a formal complaint with the Office of Title IX to initiate a University Investigation.
- Title IX staff will work with the Complainant to connect them with the appropriate office.
- During the process, a Complainants can continue to receive Supportive Measures from the Office of Title IX.

Report to Law Enforcement

- A Complainant has the right to choose to report to police.
- Office of Title IX staff will work with the Complainant to connect them with law enforcement in the appropriate jurisdiction.
- During the process a Complainant can continue to receive Supportive Measures from the Office Title IX.
